



# Weather Fact Sheet

The South West winds in the Maldives occur from May to November. During this period there can be some afternoon rain and sudden showers but also many consecutive days of sunshine. On some days during the season, it doesn't rain at all or only overnight. No matter what the weather is doing, the temperature in the Maldives typically hovers around 30c and rarely falls below an average of 25c, so you'll never get chilly!

The raindrops are normally much lighter than those in neighbouring countries such as India and Sri Lanka. It's believed to be due to the low-lying topography and lack of any large landmasses in the Maldives. Typically, the rain showers are sharp and sometimes gusty but can quickly be replaced by glorious sunshine. The rain tends to be heavier in the southern atolls - far away from Amilla, which is in the central region.
